

## Ten Questions & Answers

Q. What is my vocation?

A. My vocation is that I am an Ambassador for Christ. (II Cor. 5:20)

Q. How can I be called a saint?

A. I can be called a saint by being set apart through my words and actions.

Q. What is the greatness of His power?

A. The greatness of His power is the Holy Spirit.

Q. What is the hope of His calling?

Q. What are the eyes of the heart?

A. The "eyes of the heart" signifies the capacity for spiritual discernment.

Q. Why do they have to be enlightened before we know the hope of His calling?

A. The "eyes of the heart" have to be enlightened before we know the hope of His calling because a person has to know the truth in order to be made free. (Jn. 8:32)
